Vicky Prapas was educated at Kildara College and at Monash University where she graduated in Economics and Law. She was admitted to practice in 1991.

From 1992 to 1995, Vicky worked in a criminal law practice in Ringwood, specialising as a Solicitor Advocate appearing in Magistrates' Court and Children's Court matters, including contested and uncontested hearings, contested bail applications, and committal and contest mentions in State and Federal matters.

In September, 1995, Vicky joined the staff of the Office of Public Prosecutions where she has been involved in the prosecution of a wide range of criminal matters including murders and serious assaults, sexual offence trials, drug matters, police prosecutions and frauds.

Vicky became Training Manager for the Office of Public Prosecutions in March, 2005, which involved mentoring and guiding the articled clerks for that year, as well as the sourcing, preparation and presentation of Continuing Legal Education and training programs for the office.

In July, 2007, Vicky moved to the Organised Crime Unit and is now a Legal Prosecution Specialist of Organised Crime. As one of the most senior lawyers in the OPP, she is heavily involved in the prosecution of matters arising from Purana Taskforce investigations into "gangland" murders and associated crimes which were occurring in Melbourne in recent times.
